The Triple C team is the social justice club at St. John that strives to help others locally and globally through local and global actions. Triple C stands for Children Creating Change and the group is comprised of grade 6, 7 and 8 students who meet each week throughout the school year.



WE Day was held on September 19th at the Scotiabank Arena, with many inspirational speakers and performances. It is a unique event that celebrates the power of youth change makers. It is a celebration of the great work done last school year, as well as inspiration for local and global actions this school year and beyond. Tickets are not purchased, but earned. St. John tickets this year were based on all of the work that the Triple C team did last year, such as the WE Scare Hunger food drive for Out of the Cold, helping at the Community Centre 55 Share a Christmas program, Share a Smile Week raising funds for Operation Smile and the "street patrol", giving out food, socks and conversation to those less fortunate in downtown Toronto. Share a Smile Week was so successful that St. John was able to help 11 children receive surgeries to repair cleft lip/palate through Operation Smile.



All of the hard work from the Triple C team last year was highlighted in the WE Schools report, which not only gave St. John 13 tickets for WE Day, but we had front row seats, and two students were able to have a unique experience. Olivia R. and K in grade 8 had the opportunity to appear on stage (in front of 19,000 people) for a fun trivia game about speakers who were there that day. Olivia and K said that, "We were brought back stage and soon after brought on stage by the dj crew called Celebrity Marauders. This day was an amazing and educational experience that was both nerve wracking and exciting. This day was one of the most amazing days that we've had, and we hope to attend one day again." This year the Triple C Team started the year by participating in "We Scare Hunger." This year we set a goal of collecting 900 non-perishable food items, which is about two cans per student. The families of St. John greatly exceeded our goal, by bringing in 1,729 non-perishable food items, which exceeded not only our goal, but last year's total! All donations go to the St. Brigid Out of the Cold program. We added a little twist by making it a competition between classes this year. There will be prizes given out to the top five classes who collected the most amount of food. Ms. Carroll's class won with a total of 220 cans! Milk Bag Project

St. John Community, former parent council member and teacher at St. Joseph Catholic Elementary School Uli Licht has undertaken a project to reduce garbage and help the homeless. Ms. Licht is turning outer milk bags into plastic mats. She is collecting milk bags, ONLY THE OUTER BAG, and cutting them up into "plarn" (plastic yarn) which she then crochets into mats for homeless people. This serves two purposes: it keeps those bags out of the landfill (where they take about 25 years to decompose) and they are soft to lay or sit on for the homeless insulating much better than cardboard that is often used, and they are also hygienic because they can be easily cleaned. Ms. Licht will be working together with a high school teacher at St. Michael's Choir School who takes his students to deliver the mats to those who need them, as part of his grade 10 religion course (Social Justice). Please start collecting CLEAN & DRY milk bags and drop them off in the designated box at the school office. THANK YOU!

Once again St. John had another very successful Cross Country season. Over 100 students ran with the team and competed at the St. John race off. 86 of those students helped win the Division Championship at Earls court. 76 students advanced to the Regionals, in the rain at Earls court, which St. John also came out on top. Finally, 50 runners advanced to the City Final meet at Earl Bales, which was won by St. John for the 18th year in a row. This successful season could not have happened without the initial over 100 runners, the 7 student helpers, the 12 coaches, and the support from the parents who helped in many ways. 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

Kids and Flu

The flu germs spread when people cough, sneeze or talk. The flu germs can also live on surfaces like toys, countertops, and door handles for up to eight hours.

Students can pass the flu germs to each other, to school staff and to family members before they show symptoms. Children under five, seniors and people in poor health are at greater risk of complications from flu.

Vaccination is the best protection against flu. It takes 2 weeks for the vaccine to be fully effective so get it early.

Tips on staying healthy this flu Season:

- 1) Get your flu shot early
- 2) [Wash your hands](#) often
- 3) Avoid touching face and eyes
- 4) [Cover your cough](#) or sneeze
- 5) Do not share drinking cups and utensils
- 6) Disinfect common surfaces like door handles, hand railings, keyboards, cell phones and tablets.

Staying active and safe

- Wear waterproof and windproof outer layers, a hat and warm mittens
- Choose wool, silk or polypropylene inner layers of clothing; these materials hold more body heat than cotton
- Change into dry clothing as soon as possible if you get wet from precipitation, sweat or submersion in water
- Wear several layers of warm lightweight clothing when shoveling snow and follow medical advice if you have a history of back or heart problems
- Reschedule outdoor activities and limit time outdoors if severe weather is forecast
- Notify friends or family where you will be when going on outdoor activities, such as hiking and skiing

Flu season begins each year as early as October and continues through to May, with the peak times being between November and January. Influenza, as well as a number of other viruses that cause coughs and colds continue to circulate in Toronto. In addition, norovirus, a common cause of vomiting and diarrhea, is also being seen in Toronto.



Administration of Medication at school:

Occasionally students may need to take prescription medication at school. In order for this to take place, parents/guardians and physicians will need to complete and sign the appropriate Special Services Medical Forms’ which can be requested through the school office. The purpose of these forms is to ensure that any medication that is being administered at school is carried out as prescribed by the attending physician by school staff. Non-prescription medication cannot be administered to students. Additionally, students are not allowed to self-medicate.



ANAPHYLAXIS ALERT

We would like to inform you that we are an **allergy aware school**. There are students in attendance who suffer from severe and life threatening allergies to certain foods such as **peanuts, nut products, bananas, sesame seeds, eggs, seafood and shell fish. Anaphylaxis is a severe and life threatening allergic reaction.**

We are asking that you be mindful of this when sending lunches or snacks that may contain peanuts, nuts, bananas, eggs, seafood, shell fish and sesame seeds. As well, please check prepared foods for traces of peanut oil or nut products. These items could potentially harm a child. **We would also ask that you please do not send food for birthdays or special occasions.** There are many other alternatives such as stickers and pencils. Please remind your children not to share food in the classroom.

We thank all of you for being diligent in following this request. We must maintain as safe an environment as we possibly can for our students. Since all our students share the school building space in their daily activities, we need to take precautions to minimize any cross contamination issues.

Similarly, students are to visit the office if they need to contact their parents. Any pictures or videos published electronically are not to be taken on school property or at a school event as they must have the permission of the individuals, their parents and the principal.

VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

A reminder that **all parents and visitors must enter the school building through the front doors and report to the front office.** We ask that in the interest of safety for all students and to ensure that classes are uninterrupted, please do not walk your child to the class. **We need everyone's total co-operation and understanding on this matter.**

Adults are reminded that for safety reasons, while students are in the yard, only staff should be in the yard.

If you need to speak with your child's teacher, kindly call and make an appointment. Your child's teacher will be happy to meet with you at a mutually convenient time.



DROPPING OFF & PICKING UP STUDENTS



For the safety of all students, we ask that in the mornings you drop off your children in the appropriate sections of the school yard and leave them with our staff. **Please make sure that your child is dropped off no earlier than 8:00 a.m. Supervision in our school yard begins at 8:00 a.m.** This will help the students develop routines and it will also help our staff ensure a safe school yard.

If you are picking up your child(ren) early from school, please come to the office and sign out your child. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Kindergarten & Primary Student Drop Off



For safety reasons and to build routine, when dropping students off in the kindergarten / primary yards, we ask that all parents move away from the play areas so that they do not block our students and staff supervisors. Teachers are working to build morning routines for our students and they require your cooperation in giving them the space they need as they move from the yard to the school. Your assistance is greatly appreciated.

Safety Smarts:

Please take time to review street safety rules with your child. Parents are asked to review stranger danger rules with their children. Reminders not to talk to, follow or go home with anyone unless the parents have had a discussion with them. Having a pre-determined plan for safe arrival and departure with your child. This will help them make good decisions.



For supervision and safety reasons, students are NOT to use the front entrance of the school to **ENTER & EXIT.** Front doors are only to be used by students boarding buses at the end of the day. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Parking in Notre Dame Parking Lot:



St. John Parents **ARE NOT** to access the Notre Dame / St. John Parish parking lot during school days for pick up and drop off. We are working together with Notre Dame so please respect this request as those spots are to be used by their staff. St. John parents are asked to please use the designated St. John parking lot when picking and dropping students off.

Parent Supervision After School:



Parents, are reminded that the school yard is not supervised by school staff at 3:00 pm dismissal. If you are choosing to remain in the yard for your child to enjoy the playground, it is your responsibility to ensure your child is playing appropriately and safely so that all students can enjoy the play structures. We are asking for everyone's full cooperation with this.

Your responsibility as a Parent

- Parents are responsible for their children's safety before they board their school bus, and after they are dropped off in the afternoon.
- While on the bus, students are responsible to the school principal for their conduct. Transportation privileges may be revoked if a student's behaviour creates problems, the length of the suspension varying with the severity of the incident. If transportation privileges are revoked, it becomes the parent's responsibility to transport the child to and from school for the duration of the suspension.
- Parents are also responsible for transporting their children to and from school in cases of inclement weather or mechanical difficulty.

On the Bus

- The driver is in charge of the bus and must be obeyed at all times.
- Sit where you have been assigned and remain seated for the duration of your trip.
- Be quiet and behave sensibly. Horseplay, fighting, eating, drinking and foul language are forbidden.
- Keep your belongings on your lap or under the seat; aisle must be left clear.
- Don't open a window without the driver's consent, and never lean out the windows.
- Never throw anything inside the bus or out the windows.
- Respect the bus equipment. Students will be held responsible for any damages to the vehicle.
- Avoid conversation with and distraction of the bus driver while the vehicle is in operation.

****Purple Equals Parent Initiative (PEP program)****

TCDSB, along with our transportation companies will continue implementing the PEP Program.

It is designed to minimize the possibility of a student who requires supervision being released from a school bus without a responsible adult or sibling available to receive the student. Pamphlets describing the program will be sent home with our FDK students.


